2024 Colorado State Ballot Initiatives

Updated 9-24-24

The 2024 General Election ballot contains 14 statewide initiatives. Some are amendments to the Colorado constitution while others would make changes to state law. Some are *Referred* to the ballot by a vote of the Legislature. Others are *Citizen Initiated* measures requiring petition signatures to get to the ballot.

Below is the final list of initiatives, along with the final title, you will see on your ballot.
